§ 76-9 Special Permits

A special permit to exceed the restrictions as set forth in this chapter may be granted by the Town Zoning Board of Appeals if in its judgement it finds that the use for which such permit is sought will not, in the circumstances of the particular case and under any condition that the Board considers to be necessary or desirable, be injurious to the area or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. The Board shall impose any conditions which it deems necessary to protect the area. The Board shall deny applications for a special permit which in it's judgement would prove detrimental to adjacent property. The Board on application and after public notice and hearing, may issue a permit complying with the general standards set forth as follows:

- (1) That the Local Law causes unique hardship because of the physical nature (i.e. size, shape, location or topography) of the lot upon which the sign is to be erected.
- (2) Each special permit use must comply generally with the regulations of this chapter, for the district within which it is to be located.
- (3) Each special permit use shall be of such character, intensity, size and location that it will be in harmony with the orderly development of the district in which it is to be located.

NOTE: Applications will be accepted by the Zoning Board at the scheduled meeting following the submission of an application for a Special Sign Permit. Applications will be voted on by the Zoning Board on the month following the applications acceptance.
